It serves as a platform to instill a sense of responsibility, integrity and commitment in the newly appointed leaders from the Prefectorial Board, Peer Support Leaders, Co-Curricular Activities and Class Committees, reminding them of their duty to serve their peers and uphold the values of the school. The investiture symbolises the transition of leadership and the beginning of a new chapter of service and dedication to the school community. We congratulate all newly appointed student leaders and look forward to their contributions to the school.

SCHOOL REPORT 2025

2025 was a fruitful year for the school as we deepened meaningful partnerships and expanded enriching learning experiences both locally and globally. Through purposeful programmes that define the ***Yishunite Experience!***, we have empowered our students to become a self-directed and collaborative learner, imbue with sound values and character.

Our commitment to delivering an *Exciting, Engaging and Enriching* (3E) curriculum remains steadfast. In alignment with the EdTech Masterplan 2030, we continue to build staff capacity in AI-enabled pedagogy and strengthen resources to leverage educational technology for personalised feedback. By deepening interdisciplinary learning, we move beyond content mastery to nurture the critical thinking, ethical collaboration and complex problem-solving skills essential for a volatile future.



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Building on the resounding success of the **YSS Student Learning Festival (SLF)**, we are committed to taking learning beyond the classroom through authentic, experiential opportunities which allow students to apply theory in real-world contexts, anchoring the development of 21st Century Competencies (21CC). Furthermore, **YSS Goes Global** remains a cornerstone of our holistic curriculum. These international experiences broaden students' global perspectives and nurture cross-cultural intelligence, ensuring they remain deeply rooted in Singapore while confidently embracing the belief that the world is our school.

Academic Achievements

Academically our students performed well at the 2025 GCE O-level Examination. 52% of our students qualified for the two-year Junior College course and 94% of our students qualified for advancement to one of the five polytechnics.

At the 2025 GCE N-Level Examination, 63% of our students from the Secondary Four Normal (Academic) qualified for the Direct Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP) while 21% qualified for the Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP). From the Normal (Technical), 100% of our students qualified for entry into the Institute of Technical Education (ITE).

Academic Competitions

Our students have performed well in academic-related external competitions.

English Language

The Queen's Commonwealth Essay Competition is the world's oldest international schools' writing competition. Each year, young people write on a theme that stems from the Commonwealth's values and principles, developing key literacy skills whilst also fostering an empathetic and open-minded world view. In 2025, the focus was on 'Our Commonwealth Journey', where students were encouraged to explore the relevance of journeys in the commonwealth context, whether geographical, historical, or personal. They were also encouraged to explore journeys the

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Commonwealth has taken or may take in the future, as well as reflect on their own individual journeys.

Fifty-six students participated in the competition in 2025 and twenty-two of our students received the following accolades: 11 Bronze awards, 7 Silver awards and 4 Gold awards.

Seventy-five students received a certificate of participation and Myat Thinzar Nyein Ko from 1 Respect received the Merit Award in the Live On Festival essay writing competition organised by the National Organ Transplant Unit (NOTU), Ministry of Health. NOTU oversees both living donor and deceased donor organ transplants and plays a leading role in organising public campaigns and events to raise awareness on organ donation.

Humanities

Four students participated in the annual NUS Geography Challenge jointly organised by the NUS Department of Geography and NUS Geographical Society, with support from the Ministry of Education. Our students demonstrated remarkable resilience throughout the competition. Despite the intense competition, they persevered and showcased their dedication to learning and problem-solving. Their ability to adapt and persist under pressure was evident and each participant was awarded the Certificate of Participation.

The iTourism Challenge is an annual competition organised by Republic Polytechnic that challenges secondary school students to reimagine and innovate Singapore's tourism and hospitality landscape. In 2025, the competition invited participants to envision the future of Singapore's tourism industry while fostering positive changes across various aspects of tourism. Four Secondary 4 students emerged as Champions in this competition, demonstrating creativity, critical thinking and a strong understanding of real-world tourism issues.

The Historical Scene Investigation (HSI) Challenge 2025, an annual competition organised by the National Library Board and supported by the MOE's History Unit, challenges lower secondary students to put their historical research skills to the test. This year's competition featured 133 participating schools, with students tasked to explore the concept of change and continuity in our local neighborhoods. Four Secondary 2 students participated in the challenge and clinched first place, emerging as overall champions.



Mathematics

Our Yishunites took part in the Singapore and Asian School Mathematics Olympiad (SASMO) 2025 with Khor Kai Qian from Secondary 1 Integrity receiving a Silver Award. 3 Bronze Awards and 6 Honorable Mentions were achieved by other YSS students. Our Secondary 1 and 2 students took part in the NIE Mathematics Challenge, an online Mathematics quiz, and Olinda Tan Sze Huei from Secondary 2 Soar clinched the High Distinction award with eleven other students receiving the distinction awards.

Secondary 4 Express students took part in the Math Challenge at Ngee Ann Polytechnic where they had to relate Mathematics and Engineering concepts to real life situations. They won the Silver Award for the Kahoot Challenge.

Selected students from Secondary 1 and Secondary 2 G3 took part in the National Digital Explorer (NDE) and learnt online independently before the competition. Two students, Deepikha D/O Vijay Mohan from Secondary 2 Innovate and Ooi Ke Han Kaelyn from Secondary 2 Respect qualified for the National round.

Science

NUS Illustratum 2025

Nine Secondary 3 students participated in the annual NUS Illustratum competition. This competition provides a platform for school students to turn abstract scientific concepts into lively demonstrations, models and storytelling. The heart of the competition lies in its emphasis on science communication, retelling complex physics in a way that could be easily understood. The three teams walked away with two Distinction Awards and one Merit Award.

STEM challenge #1

Our lower secondary cohort recently showcased their creativity and problem-solving skills in the STEM Playground 2025 Challenge, jointly organised by the Science Centre Singapore, MOE (CPDD) and the James Dyson Foundation. In this exciting competition, students designed a boat powered by a chemical reaction and competed against 121 primary and

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secondary schools across Singapore. Through testing, refining and improving their prototypes, our students demonstrated resilience and teamwork. Their hard work paid off as they proudly achieved 3rd placing in the secondary school category. This remarkable achievement reflects their innovative spirit and passion for applying science beyond the classroom.

Jiemin Primary School Science Outreach

Our Secondary 2 Science Talent Programme students took part in an exciting outreach at Jiemin Primary School, where they engaged Primary 5 students through hands-on science booths. The activities included paper chromatography, where colours were separated into beautiful patterns, copper tape circuits which introduced simple electronics in a fun way, and popsicle stick catapults where students applied physics to launch small projectiles. This interactive session not only sparked curiosity and joy among the primary students but also provided our students with the chance to share their scientific knowledge and hone their communication skills in making science fun.

Singapore Youth STEM Fair (SYSF) and 23rd Elementz Science Project Competition

Eight lower secondary students displayed grit, perseverance, and innovation as they took part in both competitions. Over nearly two months, they worked tirelessly on research, project analysis, poster design, and presentations to judges. The Secondary 2 team investigated the strength and durability of different types of bioplastics, while the Secondary 1 team explored the growth rate of plants using handmade versus chemical fertilisers. Their efforts shone through, with the Secondary 2 team clinching the Accomplished Award at SYSF and a Bronze Award at Elementz, while the Secondary 1 team achieved commendation awards in both competitions.

Design and Technology (D&T)

The innovative golf ball dispenser project by D&T student Tan Jian Yu from Secondary 5N1 was shortlisted for the National D&T Awards 2025. This was recognition at national level when we were named among the shortlisted 22 schools from a pool of 51 participating institutions. Securing a spot in this top 40% is a testament to the rigorous design standards and



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innovative thinking fostered in his D&T project. This recognition validated the school's pedagogical standards at a national level, demonstrating that innovation and excellence can emerge from inclusive classroom practices.

Nutrition and Food Science (NFS)

In 2025, NFS unit collaborated with Republic Polytechnic (RP) for the first time in co-organising the Junior Chef Culinary Competition, an inter-school competition opened to all North Zone cluster schools. The theme for the competition was chilli-infused burger in which many impressive and outstanding entries from the 29 teams registered across 16 secondary schools were received. The top 10 finalist had the opportunity to attend a Masterclass conducted by RP and went on to compete in a cook-off finals at RP's industry-grade training kitchen. Our student-representatives received certificates of participation in this competition.

Visual Arts

In our ongoing effort to provide students with platforms to excel beyond the classroom, we are proud to recognise our representatives in the 2025 Live On Festival Design Competition. Organised by the National Organ Transplant Unit, Ministry of Health, this initiative challenges youths to voice their perspectives on the life-changing impact of organ donation through creative art and writing. By engaging in this sensitive topic, our students demonstrated a mature grasp of empathy, responsibility, and compassion.

Distinctive Programme

Secondary 4 Innovate student Ahmad Tirmidzi's original composition, *Goodbye to This Place*, was selected for presentation at SYF Youth Station Live. He performed the piece at *SCAPE Ground Theatre in 2025, marking a proud milestone for the school's arts journey. This achievement underscores the strength of our Distinctive Programme in nurturing authentic student voice and creative ownership, providing platforms where young composers like Ahmad Tirmidzi can develop their craft and share original work with a wider audience.

Arts Extravaganza 2025: Breakthrough

The Arts Extravaganza is a vibrant and inclusive celebration that provides Yishunites with the opportunity to showcase their involvement in various art forms to the school. The event highlights the talents and creativity of students from the performing arts Co-Curricular Activities, as well as those pursuing music and visual arts.

The Arts Extravaganza event embraced the theme of “Breakthrough”, reflecting the courage of students to push beyond their limits, explore new possibilities, and grow through the arts. Through their performances and artworks, students demonstrated resilience, creativity and the confidence to step beyond familiar boundaries in their artistic journeys.

Going Green in YSS

Yishun Secondary School has demonstrated a strong commitment to promoting environmental sustainability and instilling eco-friendly values among its students. The school's efforts to create awareness on going green are impactful, earning its recognition such as the Singapore Yellow Flame Award under the School Green Awards 2025.

The school also sustained its efforts to champion sustainability initiatives and promote environmentally responsible practices within the community. Our Green Day in the Community was organised in collaboration with Nee Soon South Zone H Resident Network, National Environment Agency (NEA), ALBA, Xishan Primary School, Northland Secondary School, and Ahmad Ibrahim Secondary School. The event seeks to advance biodiversity conservation, environmental sustainability, and green living within the wider community through interactive and educational experiences.

Achievements in Co-Curricular Activities (CCA)

We also celebrate the achievements of our students who have performed well in competitions, bringing honour to the school and their CCAs. We are very happy to announce that our Basketball B Division Girls are the newly minted Champion for the National School Games 2026 North Zone and will be proceeding to the National rounds.



National School Games (NSG) 2025 for Sports CCAs

NSG is an annual youth sports event aims to provide opportunities for students to participate in inter-school competitions and encourage character-building among student-athletes as they pursue sporting excellence. The CCAs did the school proud with the following results:
