National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP)

At MOE's Committee of Supply Debate in March 2020, MOE launched the National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP) for our schools and Institutes of Higher Education. The NDLP was launched to make digital learning inclusive by equipping students with the digital literacies to be future-ready.

Through the NDLP, all secondary school students will own a school-prescribed Personal Learning Device (PLD) by end 2021. The device will be used to facilitate an environment that encourages personalised learning.

Your child/ward will receive his/her PLD in Term 3, and we will provide more information nearer the date of distribution of the PLD.

Home-based Learning in Term 2

To better prepare our Secondary 1 students for home-based learning, the following days have been planned in Term 2 for online home-based lessons:

- 26 March 2021
- 9 April 2021
- 23 April 2021
- 7 May 2021

On the days listed above, your child/ward will not report to school but will instead be attending online lessons at home. They will be briefed by their teachers on what they need to do. Within each 40 minute block, there will be a 30 minute live lesson conducted by the subject teacher, with a 10 minute break for our students to do self-study between lessons or complete the assigned work given by the teachers. There will also be a 20 minute break from 9:40 am to 10:00 am for them to have some snacks at home.

Beyond Our Classrooms

In line with MOE's initiative to enable students to explore their interests and passions, and learn within and beyond the curriculum, the school will also incorporate the *Student Initiated Learning* programme on days scheduled for HBL. All Secondary 1 students will be part of this pilot programme which spans 8 weeks in Term 2 and 3. It forms part of the school's effort to nurture self-directed learning and intrinsic motivation in our students.

The Student Initiated Learning programme, dubbed Beyond Our Classrooms, is designed to provide a unique experience for Yishunites in two modules. In the first module which will be carried out in Term 2, the pursuit of students' passion is integrated with the school's Distinctive programmes. Thus, the focus in this module would be to excite students with an array of activities related to the school's niche of Music, Media and Technology.

The Secondary 1 students have been briefed about the programme as well as the contents of the two modules in an online assembly conducted on 4 March. The students have made their choices for their preferred electives for module 1. They will be informed of the electives they have been assigned to by 24 March. In the first session which will be conducted on 26 March, students will be reminded to log in to the Student Learning Space (SLS) at 11:50 am. They will then be given instructions on the follow up activities and the subsequent zoom sessions.

Module 2 will be carried out in Term 3. In this module, students will also be encouraged to pursue interests in areas related to the language, culture and customs of the countries in Asia to deepen their understanding of our regional neighbours and our connections to them. This is in line with MOE's thrust to prepare our students to engage with Asia, in particular the ASEAN region. HOD/ Special Project (Learning Innovation) will conduct another briefing for the Sec 1 students on 6 May to provide more detail about the electives in Term 3.
